- (1) Test will be conducted once during the last day of classes. You will be evaluated based on your speaking, listening, reading, and writing (4 areas). For the speaking test, there will be a 1:1 interview between the student and the teacher. A written test will be given for the reading, writing, and listening portion. If you are absent on the day of the test, there will be no exceptions to retake the test. Exceptions are allowed only to those who have a formal evidence as to why they were absent.
- (2) From the total 15 classes, the student must attend 12 or more classes to receive a grade. If a student attend 11 or less classes, he/she is going to get fail.
